Another brother, Michael Jones, 13, helped Russell on his newspaper route last year.

Other contributions for the Bayles family have come in from all parts of the city—from concerned factory workers to sympathetic patrons of a beauty salon to people who simply know what it is to be struck by tragedy.

Until today, information concerning contributions channeled through The Star had not been published. It was believed the publicity might add to the family's grief and pain.

But the spontaneous outpouring of help has grown steadily, from all levels of life, offering the family new hope and comfort.

AMONG THE first to come forward were business and professional people in the neighborhood around 34th and Illinois streets.

Mrs. Lilly May Starks of Lilly May's Beauty Salon, 56 West 34th Street, collected \$48 from them, and added her own \$5 contribution.
