

Dynamite Blast Damages School

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — An explosion of dynamite damaged a rear door at Wood High School here Wednesday night.

The blast occurred about 10:45 p.m. Witnesses said they saw two boys run from the area to a parked vehicle.

The high school, at 501 S. Meridian, occupies buildings that formerly houses Manual High School, now located in new facilities on the Indianapolis South Side.

It is a manual training school.

A service station on 38th St. was damaged by fire in what police said was definitely a case of arson.

Paul McDougall, 29 years old, the assistant manager of Pat's Texaco Station, suffered leg burns when he tried to enter the burning building. He is in fair condition in General Hospital.
